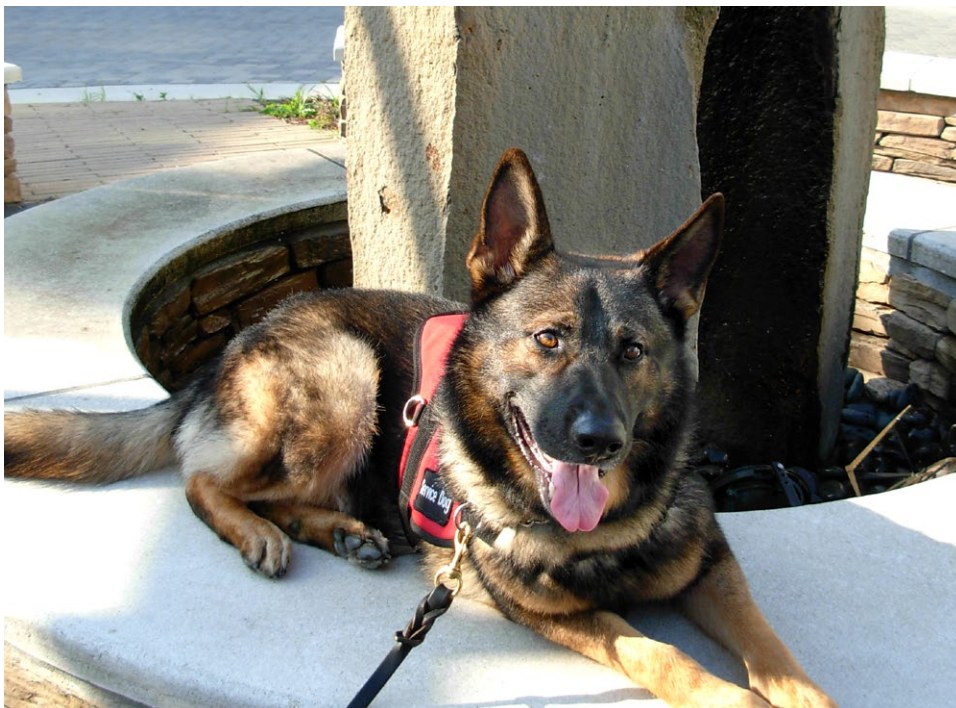

Somedays are tough though. I can tell when Eric's in pain. Sometimes it's physical. Sometimes it's anxiety. I remember once he was being interviewed about how he got his injury, and I could sense that he was getting upset as he explained the crash. I came up to him and rested my head on his lap. He looked down and smiled, and I got a really good head rub. We're a team. We take care of each other.

I keep an eye on Eric because he is so important to me. On our very first night together in the hotel, I trotted ahead of him down the hallway—checking around every corner, and then I ran into our room first just to check it out - the bathroom, between the beds, even the closets. I wanted to make sure that my friend was safe before he went to bed.

And not just Eric. I keep an eye out for Eric's whole family—his beautiful wife, Melissa and their three boys (Keenan, Mastin, Lochlen) and daughter (Josilyn). Once Eric and Melissa forgot to tell me that the kids had gone to their grandfather's house in Pennsylvania for an overnight. I kept checking their bedroom until Eric assured me that our family was safe and secure and that we could all now hit the sack.

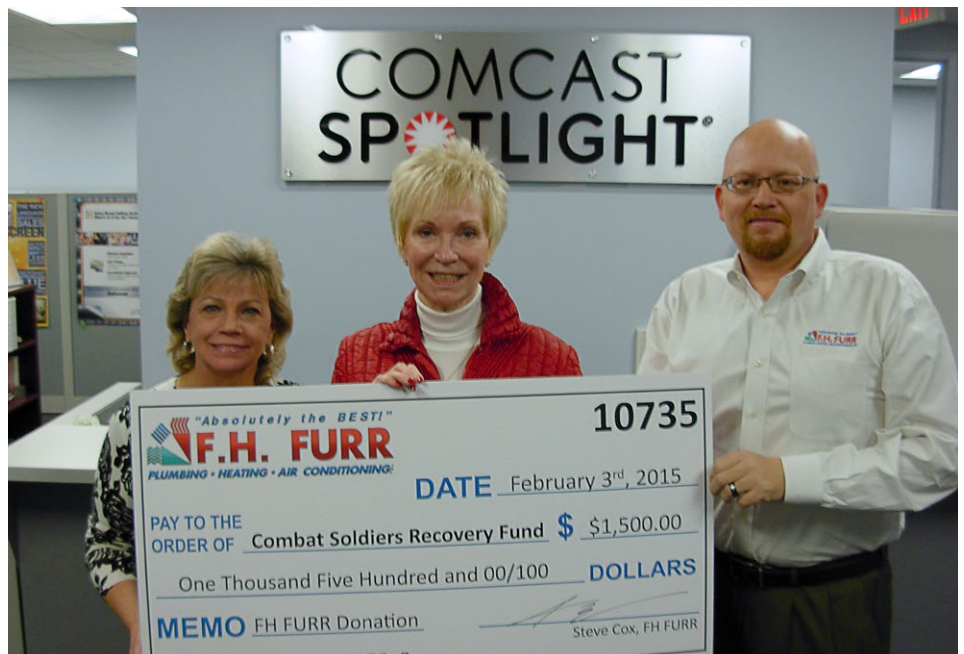
